Type – **TORNADO**



On June 15, 2023, when the Texas Division of Emergency Management (TDEM) activated TX-TF1 and TX-TF2 as Type 3 Wide Area Search teams to respond to a tornado in Perryton, Texas. The following morning on June 16, 2023, the teams conducted multiple searches and a Hazardous Materials recon of industrial areas effected by the tornado. The teams also located a missing person safely. On June 17, 2023, TX-TF1 was released and returned to College Station while TX-TF2 remained overnight. TX-TF2 was demobilized on June 19, 2023 after no further requests.

On June 21, 2023, TX-TF2 was once again activated- this time to respond to a tornado in Matador, TX. They arrived early the next morning, June 22, 2023, and began conducting requested searches. The Task Force Leader and Safety Manager conducted aerial recon overhead in a Department of Public Safety plane. After completing all requests, the team was demobilized on June 22, 2023.

On the same day, TDEM requested one Plans Manager and two Logistics Managers to assist the Texas A&M Forest Service in Texas Region 1. They were to assist with Base Camps in East Texas at the Incident Command Post. Over the next few days the Plans Manager acted as a Technical Specialist and performed duties as requested, while the Logistics Managers coordinated members sleeping and feeding. All three members were released back to their home stations on June 25, 2023.
